#### **RUSSELL GROUP UNIVERSITY @ SHEPPEY**

On January 27th, Year 10, 11 and Sixth Form students who were high prior attainers at their primary schools were lucky enough to be spoken to by the University of Southampton representatives.

This university is part of the Russell group. The Russell Group represents 24 leading UK universities. They believe people and ideas are the key to meeting global challenges. At these universities, world-class research and education are prioritised and used to solve some of the biggest challenges facing us right now, such as research into potential cures for cancer, advanced space flight and environmental issues.

Throughout the talk, students were introduced to university and why they should consider one of the top universities and all of the advantages this could offer. They were shown different aspects of university life and some of the amazing courses on offer at Southampton but also across the country. Some of these courses included things such as oceanography, aerodynamics, wildlife conservation and many more. They were also shown the other side of university life and shown how there is a great opportunity to bridge being a student at school and an adult by studying full time and living either away form home or at home.

Finally, our host went through, probably, the most worrying side of university to most and discussed student finance. Once student commented 'it was really good to hear that when we get student finance we don't have to start paying it back until we earn more than £25,000, and then we only need to pay a small amount back'.

When asked if they found it useful, another student commented that 'I hadn't thought of going to any university never mind one of the top universities in the country but I can now see that this isn't out of reach if I keep working hard'.

As always, all students were respectful and a credit to themselves and the academy.

#### **Primary Schools Athletics tournament**

On Wednesday 25th January, the Academy hosted the Primary school indoor athletics tournamen, attended by primary schools from across the Swale area. During the event, students participated in a number of events ranging from relay races to throwing and jumping events with the students displaying excellent teamwork, enthusiasm and athletic ability. A number of our students supported as Sport Hosts to help facilitate the events. There was a real 'buzz' in the sports hall with our visiting students all leaving with a smile on their faces having enjoyed a fantastic day of being part of a team.

#### Queen's Green Canopy – Tree Planting – February 2023

Over the final two weeks of Spring term 1, some of our incredible students had the opportunity to join in with planting trees alongside Medway Swale Estuary Partnership and the Hub Team as part of the Queen's Green Canopy initiative. Trees were planted at both Minster and Sheerness campuses with around 25 students involved throughout the whole project. In total, over 600 trees were planted across the two campuses, over four days. Students really enjoyed the opportunity getting involved and said that it felt they were becoming part of the history of the school, and hoped if they were to return to the campuses in years to come they would see the trees grown and know they were part of the initial group making this happen.

Students were able to work on so many personal development skills throughout including team work, confidence and perseverance as well as valuable outdoor education skills. We are really proud of the students who got involved and we are looking forward to continuing this project with both the original group and a wider group of students to look after the new saplings whilst they bed into the ground and begin to develop and grow.
