Key Vocabulary

Lesson One	<p>Prejudice: To know the definition of Prejudice. To understand some of the things people can be prejudice about. To be able to explain how people get their prejudice ideas</p>
Lesson Two	<p>Discrimination: To know what is meant by discrimination. To understand that some people are treated unfairly because of their characteristics. To be able to identify negative and positive discriminatory behaviour.</p>
Lesson Three	<p>Segregation: To know what is meant by the term apartheid. To understand how black people were treated under the apartheid system. To be able to identify the difference between prejudice and discrimination.</p>
Lesson Four	<p>Racism: To know examples of racism To understand that racism still exists particularly in sport. To be able to make your own decisions on punishments for racists</p>
Lesson Five	<p>Attitudes: To know and recognise racist attitudes To understand reasons and decisions towards racism To be able to explain the difference between overt and covert discrimination</p>
Lesson Six	<p>Good Samaritan: To be able to describe the story of the good Samaritan To understand the meaning of the story To be able to discuss the relevance of the Good Samaritan story in today's world</p>

Word	<p>Prejudice - judging someone before you know them. Stereotype - judging a whole group of people by one standard</p>
Word	<p>Tolerance - Accepting other people and valuing them even if they are different. Bias - favouring of one side or another</p>
Word	<p>Harmony - Living in peace with others. Understanding others even if they are different Segregation - separating a race, class, or group from the rest of society</p>
Word	<p>Justice - People are treated equally and in a fair way regardless of their race/ religion / gender etc</p>
Word	<p>Discrimination - Acting on or holding unreasonable preconceived judgments or opinions formed unfairly or without knowledge of the facts:</p>
Word	<p>Equality - Everyone having the same chances to do what they can. Some people may need extra help to get the same chances. Racism - Treating someone unfairly because of their race, colour, nationality, ethnic or national origins.</p>
